We have so many wonderful opportunities to touch young lives on a daily basis here at Firewall that it is difficult sometimes to pick a story, but this month Hannah Britain who has been on staff with us along with her husband since August had a very special and personal experience that she wants to share with you our supporters.

Teenagers constantly battle with issues regarding image and acceptance by their peers. Any deviation from what their peers view as "normal" can be socially crippling. I experienced the effects of being different throughout my teen years due to the loss of some of my permanent teeth.

I was so self-conscious that I rarely smiled in public for fear that the people would see my false teeth or that one of them would slip out of my mouth while talking. As I grew into adulthood I was fortunate to receive permanent teeth implants. I have prayed to God many times to open doors for me to share my story with young teen girls who are going through similar situations. God granted my request and introduced me to Mandy while working at Firewall. God had placed her in my life because she was battling the same issues I did as a teenager. When you can't smile, people cannot see the love of Christ in you.

I instantly smiled when I met this 15 year old girl. Mandy is tall and slender and has the sweetest disposition and sees no wrong in anybody she meets. Some may call that innocence but I call that a gift. But Mandy was struggling with her image. She is all smiles in one on one encounters, but in a group or when posing for pictures in front of the camera, she would barely smile because she was afraid of showing her missing teeth. Dealing with the same issue as a teenager, I felt her pain and made it a mission to find a way to give her her smile back. When you truly ask the Lord for direction, he not only gives you the right direction, but walks along side you as well.

During a visit to my dentist, I felt a tug from the Lord to share what I do at Firewall. My dentist was so fascinated that she asked if there were any kids that needed dental work and that she would do it for free. Mandy instantly popped into my head and I shared Mandy's story with her. She was filled with such compassion that she agreed to give Mandy teeth. God answered the prayers that I had been praying for since last August.

Last Monday, Mandy received temporary teeth implants. She no longer has to hide her beautiful smile when she talks to people. I know she had been praying for God to give her teeth and I am so thankful to the Lord that the opportunity came across my lap to share Mandy's story with my dentist. When we pray for open doors, God not only gives us the open door, but also walks along side us while we push the door open and go inside.
